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


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Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Report

## Dear Downtown Helena Property Owner,

The Helena Business Improvement District (HBID) is a public organization funded by over 400 properties who invest in the vitality of our downtown community. Through an annual assessment paid to the organization, the HBID funds programs and services in the form of streetscape beautification, assists with economic development, partners with the City and other local organizations, and continues to support vibrancy in our historical downtown. We are pleased to share the HBID's FY21 accomplishments, services, and programming. But first, here is a letter from the Chair of the HBID, *Rex Seeley*.

The HBID is continuing to improve our good relationships with the city manager and departments. We are considering additional services that we are good at to help improve and consolidate downtown processes like pedestrian trash removal, event coordination, and streetscape beautification.

We are working with property owners, the city manager and finance to make the HBID tax assessment equitable and simple. The subcommittee has made progress, especially in making it understandable and fair. Jim Burrington is doing a great job cleaning up property definitions and working with data bases to evaluate the impact of different fees on the assessment.

Downtown survived COVID and many businesses have increased sales after adapting and improving their appeal to customers. It was great to see Helena shoppers support the businesses they love. Alive at 5 is back, as are other downtown events. Parking issues have decreased, and we have an hour free parking. Parking permits and metered parking have returned to normal levels, with some months even surpassing prior years.

We are seeing increased investment downtown with new building and remodeling going on. Investment and growth should increase with the availability of Urban renewal TIFF funding and the city surplusing more property. This will help increase downtown property values and the vitality of Helena.

Things just keep getting better downtown.

\*Income Notes - We received \$14,000 less in assessments then projected; received a PPP loan for \$32,529.45 which will show up in FY22 budget; and received a \$30,000 URD grant for the 300-block tree project which will show on the books for FY22 instead of FY21 as hoped.
